Here's this week's excerpt of the history of our school by Sue Kay, a past Deputy Head.... Part Three. The 1970's

"Another great contrast with today was the number of children who walked to school. When the school first opened over 80% of the children walked to school, the majority of the seven year olds on their own. After school four or five children would regularly stay behind to help with tidying the classroom, sharpening pencils or cleaning paint pots. The only stipulation the staff had was that parents were told that their child would be a little late that day, and after helping the children would walk home together"

The Year 2 SATS start next week and will continue throughout May. Please do not take any holidays during this period. These tests are essential in helping moderate the teacher's judgements and will influence the end of year levels that your child will then take up to Coleshill Primary with them. Thank you for your support in this.



Please, please make sure that your child has a <u>sun hat</u> for school now that the weather has really warmed up. Please also smoother them in a high factor, 8 or 12 hour sunscreen before they come to school. Please <u>DO NOT send sunscreen</u> into school for your child to apply themselves. We have children in school who may be allergic to some sunscreens so please apply BEFORE school. Please <u>DO NOT send in sunglasses</u>. These can be extremely dangerous if they smash when a child is outside and playing. By ensuring their sun hat shields their eyes, there is no need for sunglasses in school.

To help ensure your child keeps safe in the sun, if they do arrive in school without a sun hat then we will request that they stay in the shade during playtime. Thank you for your support in this.

Attendance Reports

Today you will find your child's attendance report in their book bag for the period from the start of the academic year in September 2017 until we finished for the Easter break. Please remember that we should all be aiming for higher than 97%. Our Attendance policy states...

- 98% 100% Pupil should be congratulated. High attendance levels should be maintained.
- 95% 97% Attendance at this level is beginning to cause concern. Your child's class teacher will have a chat with you to see how we can work together to remedy any issues.
- 91% 94% There are serious concerns over attendance at this level. You will be sent a first formal letter from the Head Teacher to attend a meeting to discuss any remedial actions that may need to be put in place.
- 85% 90% A pupil with this level of attendance is in a high risk group and will be identified as persistently absent. You will be sent a second formal letter to put in place an action plan to address any underlying issues. The school may also send a referral to the ACE team.
- Below 85% A pupil with this attendance level will be monitored closely for six weeks. After six weeks of attendance at this level or below, the pupil will be referred to ACE who will apply intensive solution focused Casework/Legal Intervention

Please expect a letter if your child's attendance is at 94% or below.

Attendance - 'Every Child Attending Every Day'

Good attendance (97%+) is key to academic success and missing just one or two days each half term can have a detrimental impact on a child's learning and progress. The LA may send out fines to famillies who are deemed to be 'persistently absent'. Our Attendance Policy can be found on our school website if you need further clarification.
